**Benefits QuickLINK:** The Urban League of Southern Connecticut (ULSC) in collaboration with AARP Foundation, announces Benefits QuickLINK, an online access tool to state, federal and private programs for low to moderate INCOME INDIVIDUALS 50+, the disabled and children.

Benefits QuickLINK is a pilot program that informs citizens of benefits they may be eligible for and provides information on how to apply for assistance such as food benefits, prescription drug assistance and other state programs through the Benefits QuickLINK website <http://www.benefitscheckup.org>

Applicants can call or come into ULSC's office located at 46 Atlantic Street in Stamford, from 9am to 5pm Monday – Friday to receive a pre-screening questionnaire. If they qualify, applicants can apply directly online with a ULSC program specialist. There is an initial list of at least nine (9) questions that the prospective applicant must answer to see if they qualify for benefits through this program. Questions such as where do you live, City, State, Date of Birth, Citizenship status, current employment status, number of persons in the household and the Annual household gross income (annual income before taxes).
